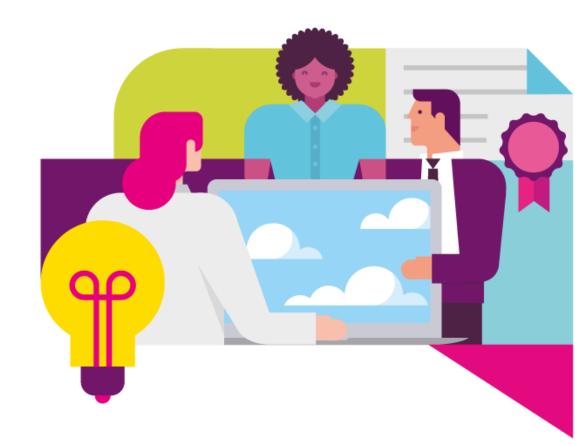

## M&R SRA Diversity Survey 2019 vs 2017

The data in this slide-deck comes from the SRA Diversity surveys conducted by Morale Solutions on behalf of M&R in 2017 and 2019.

M&R already has access to the raw data from these surveys. This analysis compares the results from the two surveys. We have used the 'Notes' pages on the slides to explain any key findings from the analysis.

#### **Definitions**

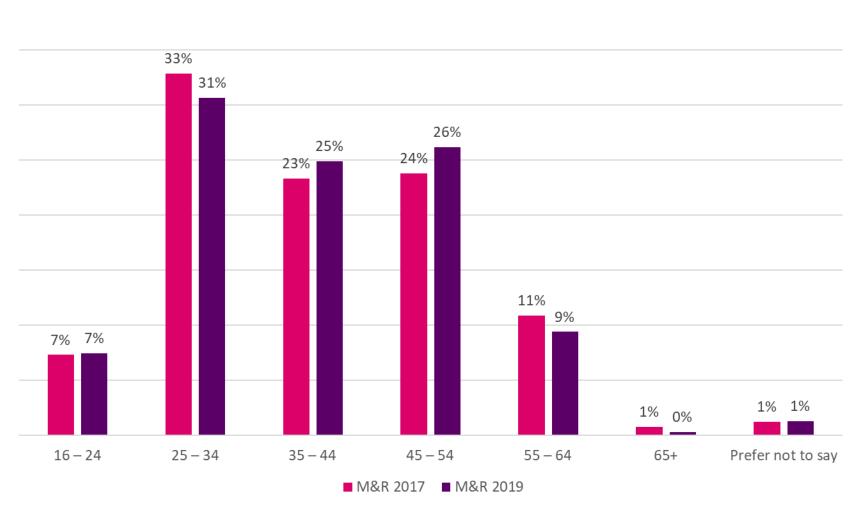
The reporting groups of Partner, Solicitor, Other Legal and Business Services are aggregated from the following (prescribed) categories within the SRA questionnaire

- Partner Solicitor Partner
- Solicitor Solicitor (not partner), Other fee earning role, Barrister, Chartered Legal Executive (Fellow)/CILEx Practitioner, Licensed Conveyancer, Patent or Trade Mark Attorney, Costs Lawyer, Notary
- Other Legal Role directly supporting a fee earner
- Business Services Managerial role, IT/HR/other corporate services role

For some of the slides we have included the 'Prefer Not To Say' results (where we think this was useful/appropriate).

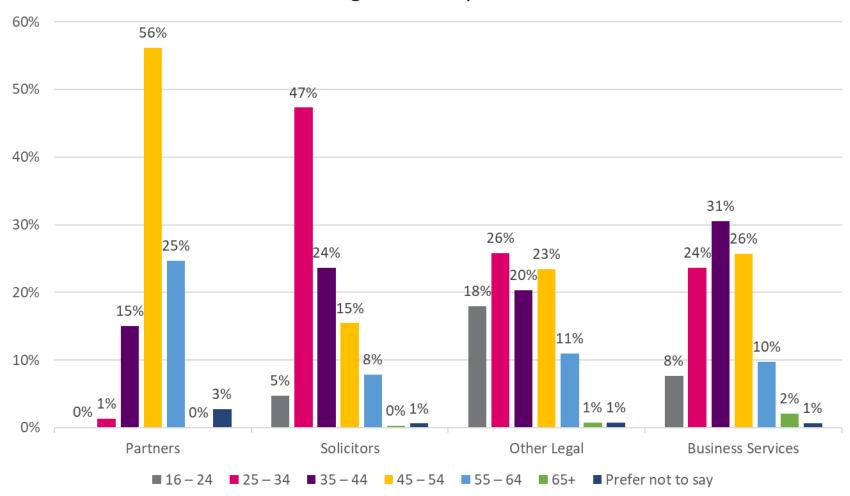


#### Age Profile (all roles)



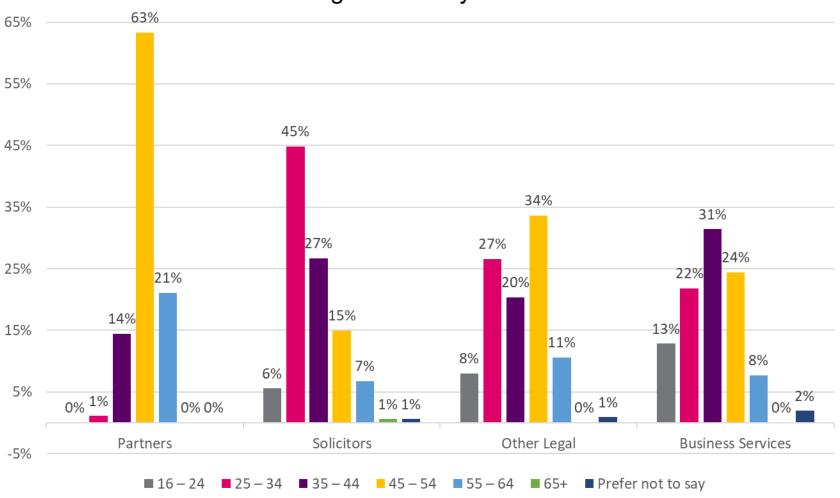


2017 Age Profile By Role



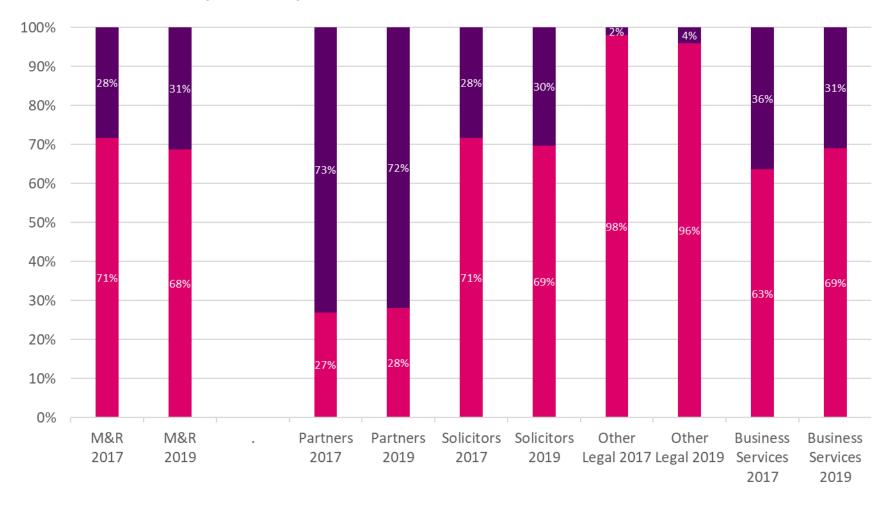


2019 Age Profile By Role



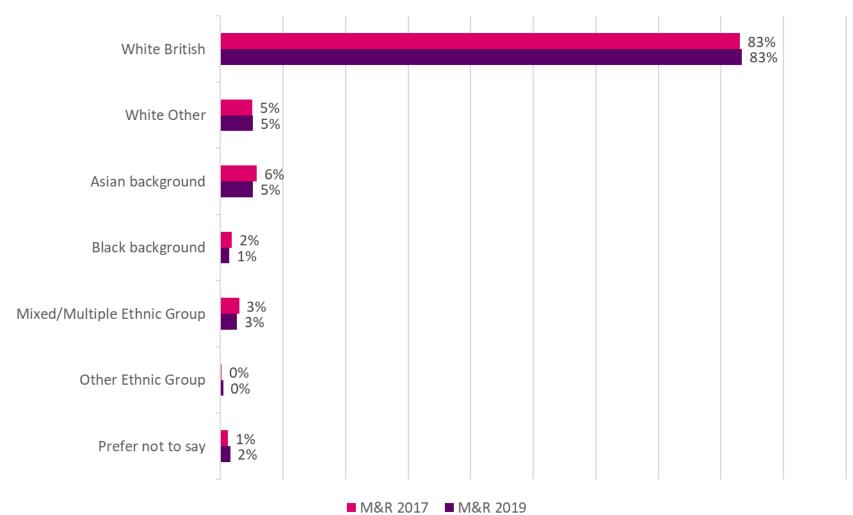


#### Gender Split By Role Type





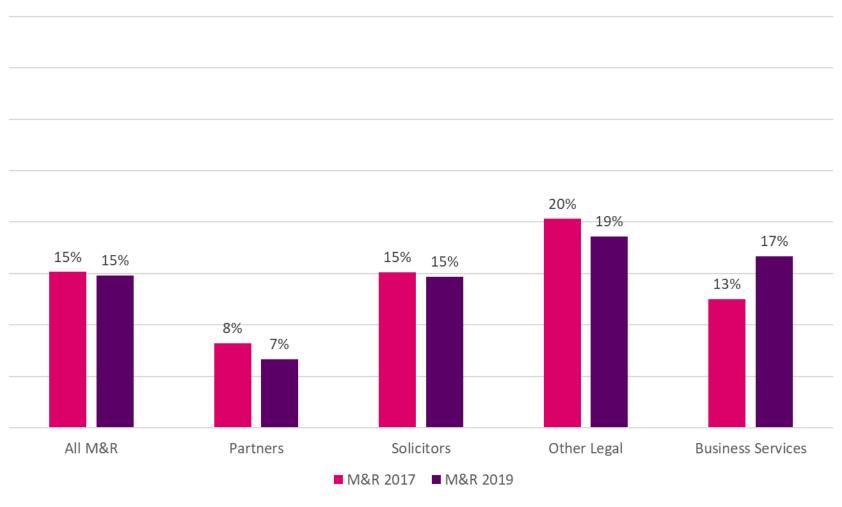

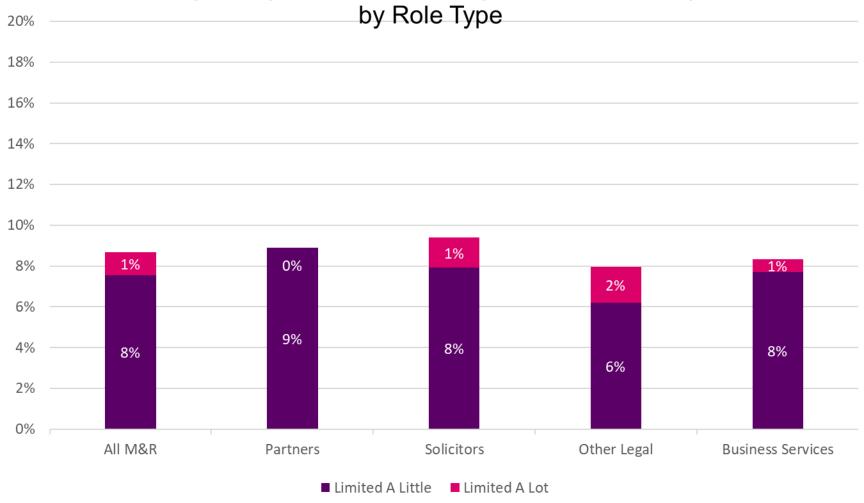

## % of Staff from BAME Groups (including other White) By Role Type



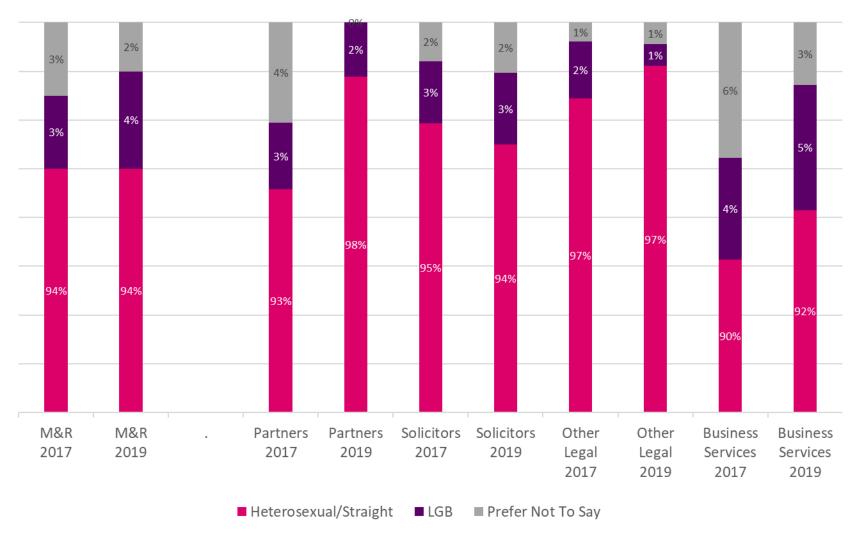


## Disability 2019 Day to day activities limited by health or disability



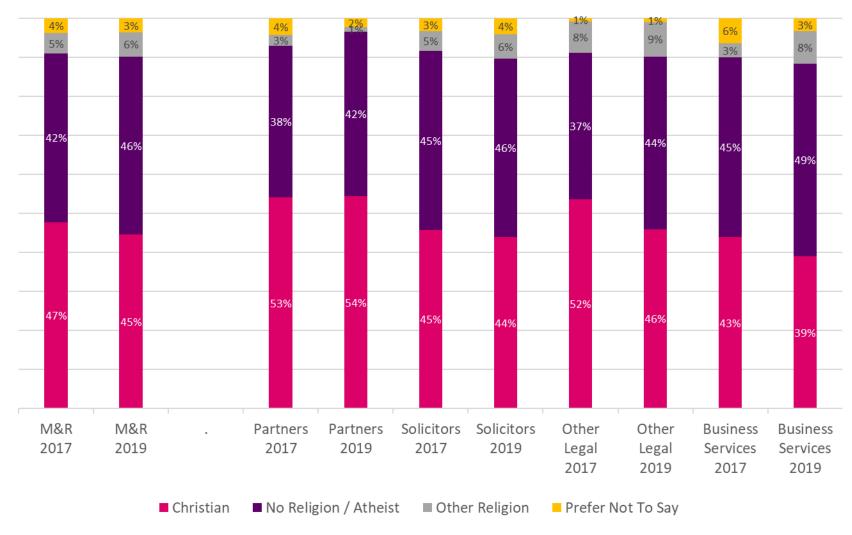


#### Sexual Orientation By Role Type



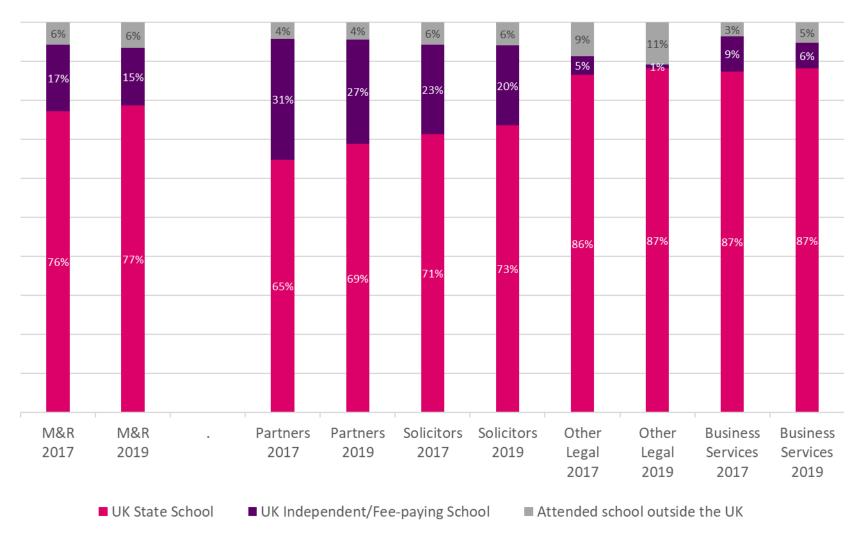


#### Religion or Belief By Role Type



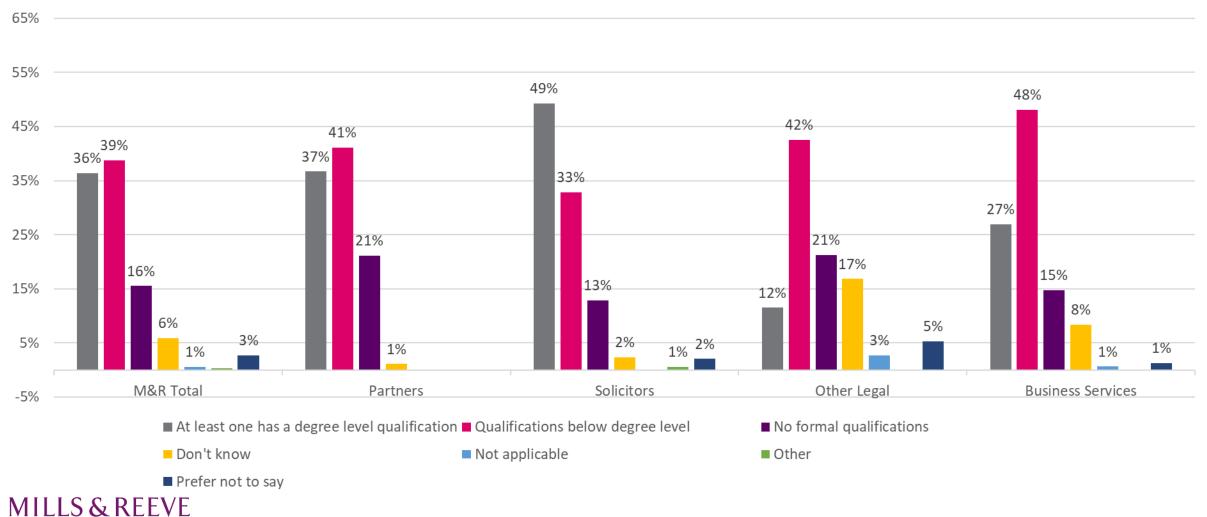

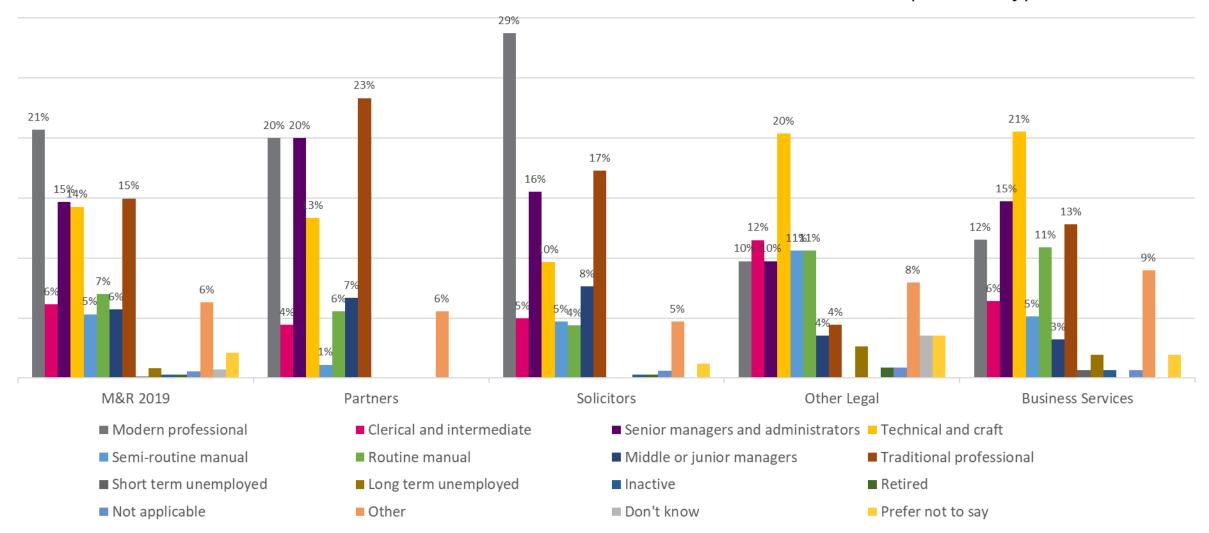


## Highest Level Of Education Achieved By Parent or Guardian (2019 only)



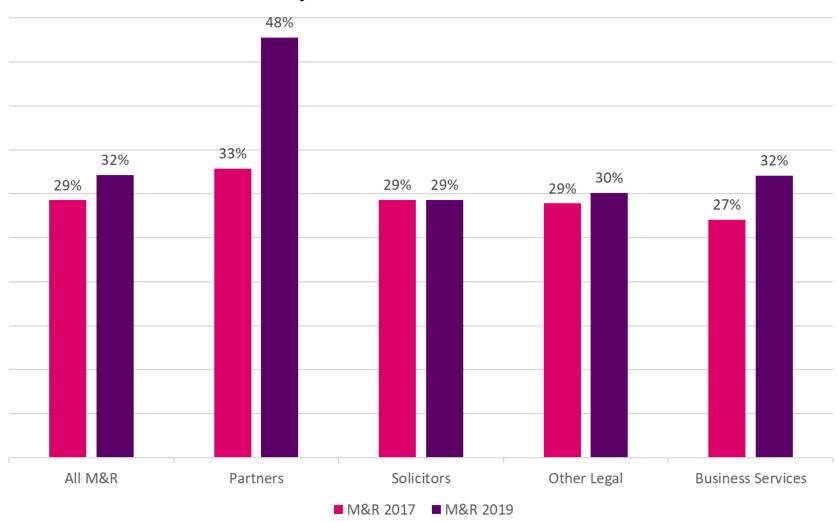

#### Role Of Main Income Earner When You Were 14 (2019 only)



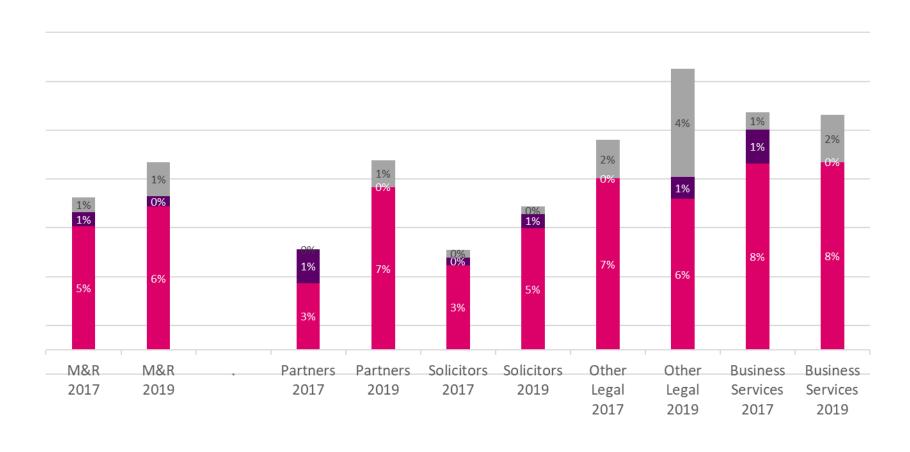


#### Primary Carer For A Child Under 18

# M&R - SRA Diversity Survey 2019 vs Benchmarks

The data in this slide-deck compares M&R's 2019 SRA Diversity survey against benchmark data from the following 2 sources

- The SRA's own Benchmark data from its <u>2017</u> survey (aggregated across all firms). Note the aggregated data from 2019 is not yet available.
- The Law Society's "Trends in the solicitors' profession" Annual Statistics Report 2018 (published in August 2019)

**NB:** the definition of Lawyers in the SRA data is taken to mean with Partners OR Solicitors.

We have taken some relevant screen shots from the 2 reports and added M&R's comparative data alongside.

We will leave it to M&R's own discretion as to which data to use and publish on its website (and of course you will want to apply your own in-house style to the presentation of that data)



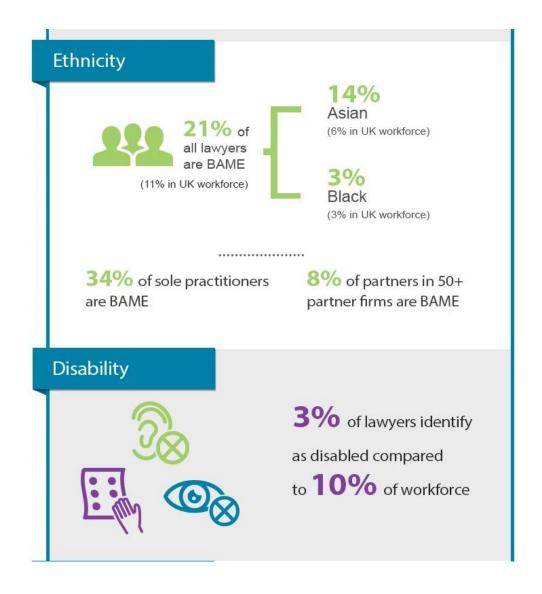


68% of all M&R staff are Women. 61% of all Lawyers (Partners + Solicitors) are Women.

28% of Partners are Women (from the HR system, not the SRA Diversity survey).

15% of all M&R staff are in BAME Groups (this definition includes the "Other White" category and is effectively all M&R staff who are not White British).





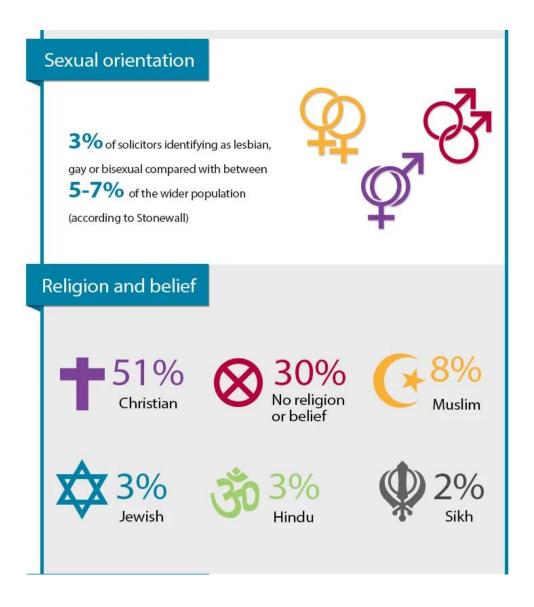
When we look at Lawyers only (Partners + Solicitors), 13% are in BAME Groups (including Other White).

If we remove Other White from this definition, then 9% of M&R Lawyers are in BAME Groups (5% Asian, 1% Black, 3% Mixed/Multiple)

For M&R Partners, 7% are BAME (incl Other White). If we exclude Other White, 6% of M&R Partners are BAME (5/90 Partners who responded to the SRA survey).

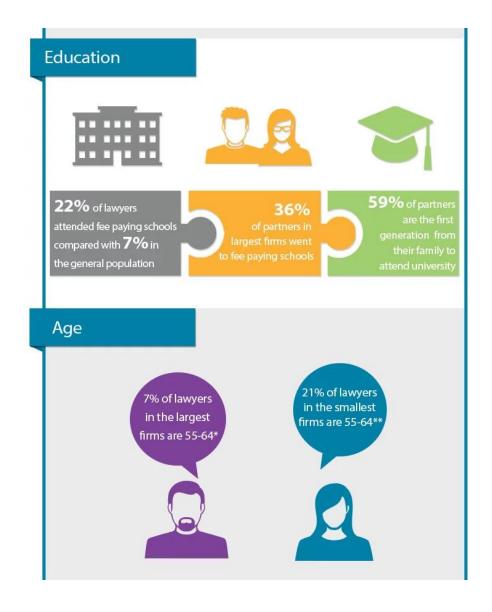
7% of all M&R staff (and also 7% of Lawyers) identify as disabled.





3% of Lawyers at M&R are lesbian, gay or bisexual.

45% of all M&R staff are Christian. 46% have no religion of belief 9% are in other religions.



22% of M&R Lawyers attended fee paying schools. (27% of Partners and 20% of Solicitors)

10% of M&R Lawyers are aged 55-64.

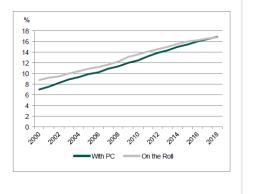

#### M&R 2019 Data

We are comparing TLS's "With Practising Certificate" category against the Lawyers classification established in the SRA survey.

When we look at Lawyers only (Partners + Solicitors), 13% are in BAME Groups (including Other White).

If we remove Other White from this definition, then 9% of M&R Lawyers are in BAME Groups (5% Asian, 1% Black, 3% Mixed/Multiple).

Therefore M&R's comparative result is 9% bs TLS's 14%.
